The Chair gave a verbal update on the B5301 including outstanding matters from the road safety report and the very poor condition of the road at Arkleby.

The Chair had provided a verbal report which included that application for access has been re-submitted and that the council is being formally consulted on this and the ROMP application. There is a public meeting at 10am on Saturday 13th May in Plumbland Village Hall to bring the residents up to date. There has been communication from the solicitor who is fighting the application on several fronts.

55/2023 PLUMBLAND WASTE TREATMENT WORKS

The chair brought to attention an article in the Times newspaper regarding the large number of discharges into the river Ellen which were unacceptable. Members considered that the treatment works were not big enough and not fit for purpose.

56/2023 SPEEDING/SPEED WATCH

The Chair gave a verbal report on the Community Speed Watch, the Speed Indication Devices, and the Camera Van, all of which help to reduce speed in the parish.

57/2023 PARISH SPRING CLEAN

There will be a Parish Clean Up on Saturday 17th June 2023 starting at 10am at Plumbland Village Hall.

58/2023 CLINTS QUARRY

The chair advised that there had been no developments since the refusal of the Certificate of Lawful Development.
